Monday, January 23 a day of Penance: January 22nd is the anniversary of Roe v. Wade. In all the dioceses of the Unites States, our bishops have asked that this day be observed as a particular day of penance for violations against the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion; they ask as well that this day be one of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life. We ask parishioners to offer special prayers and do penance for that intention. Please note that the day of penance is observed on Monday, Jan. 23rd since Jan. 22 falls on a Sunday.
